Re: Presentation – Enfield Skate Park Design

BACKGROUND:

With the adoption of the Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Budget, the City Council directed staff to construct a skate park at Enfield Park along Catalina Avenue, to be placed where the former tennis courts currently sit. Public meetings were held with several local skaters on two different occasions – May 11, 2017 and June 14, 2017 – to discuss the park layout, features and design. The consensus among the skaters was they wanted a street park – a park that contained a half-pipe, angle wall, ledge, manual pad, and flat rails. During the June 26, 2017 Regular Meeting, the City Council approved \$200,000 to build the skate park.

ANALYSIS:

Parks & Recreation advertised the Request for Quote (RFQ) for the Enfield Skate Park Project on July 27, 2017. Although the opportunity to submit a project quote was open to all qualified firms, Artisan Skateparks, Inc. (ASI) was the only company to submit a bid. ASI has constructed skate parks in several locations along the east coast, as well as in Texas, Arizona, and Colorado. They submitted a project bid of \$180,000; and this covers complete design and turn-key construction. In addition to the site visits, public meetings and design completion, ASI will perform site staking and excavation, rebar, forms and coping reviews, shotcrete, flatwork, and final project walk-through. ASI expects to satisfy the City's deadline of the March 1, 2018 completion date. The project groundbreaking is expected immediately following the Local Government Commission (LGC) approval of the City's financing package.

STAFF RECOMMENDATION:

For informational purposes, Artisan presents to the Council the new Enfield Skate Park design.
